Update on Brad Nehring

Our son, Brad, has been working with the Peace Corps this past year. They're in the middle of the rainy season which in some ways has been easier than he expected. But the combination of heat and wet has been lucrative in terms of bugs hatching. He isn't sure what is in the hut now, but he said he has hundreds of bug bites. They have several wonderful projects going on now. The biggest one is digging several new wells which are desperately needed. He is also starting an adult literacy program that he is very excited about.

He has made more contacts with businesses in Livingstone that are good resources for labor and materials. His biggest struggle continues to be the malaria medication. He is unable to sleep much -about 2 hrs a night which wears on him. He's asking for prayers about the malaria issues. He loves hearing from people.

When I first joined TLC, I had no idea what a "Circle" was. I'd been a Lutheran all my life, but never belonged to a church with circles. I'd hear about meetings occasionally, but was not particularly compelled to seek them out. Then one day Linda Kurz invited me to come join Dorcas Circle. The meetings were held in different homes of the members, there would be treats and a Bible study. Sounded like a good way to meet a few people on a more personal level.

So I went. At first I felt sort of out of place. Half of the group was around my age, and the other half about my mother's age. I didn't know these people very well, and the Bible study was nice, but not particularly profound. I thought about dropping out, but something (the Holy Spirit?) propelled me to keep at it. I kept attending every month.

After a while, I got to host the group at my house.

Now I can't imagine leaving this group! These women have become my friends. We have shared the ups and downs of life; our prayers together have reflected what is most important in our lives. We've signed and sent out dozens of cards to friends who are shut in, hospitalized or going though a rough time. We have had some "ah-hah" moments in our studies. We've supported important causes with our monthly contributions. We have consumed not a few calories and shared some yummy recipes. We have served together at the funerals of three of our members. Sometimes we've cried, and at other times had a good belly laugh.

This is what it's about. Caring for each other with Christ as our center. --Elizabeth Snodgrass

If you have a wife like mine, you can never say it enough and it never loses its meaning. It is also always appreciated.

I play this game with Virginia. I will call her from strange places, with my cell phone it's easy, but I'll call her from telephone pole 272 along Highway 16 for example and say, "Have you ever been told I love you from pole 272...."

She just laughs and tells me to get back to work.

I called her with the same message from a park bench in Lincoln Park and from the deck of a Washington State Ferry.

The message is always the same. I love you.

The great thing is that it honors her and everything my parents and my pastors have taught me. And it reminds me to be appreciative of this tremendous gift from God she is.

Am I too sappy? Maybe so, but she's even sappier than I and I love her for that as well.

All this I've learned to say when life was going pretty well. But I got sick.

In an unrelenting way every day, it seems, brings on a new and more distressing symptom or complication of my disease. I get fatigued and weary and my optimism wants to hide from me and the world. Some days I can't even open my Bible or listen to music, or watch a funny movie. Some days I see nothing but black and feel like I'll never be well or happy again. Some days I feel so sad that I know I am sinning by closing myself off from God by closing myself off from my wife. But something always saves me.

Yesterday it was chicken soup. Homemade chicken soup set before me by my wife. I smelled its wonderful aroma and looked into this potpourri of goodness. I looked at the special Virginia touches done just for me. The whole wonderful meal made just for me, and I am overwhelmed.

My wife thinks I'm special enough to use her limited energy to do what ever it takes to get me through this illness. She thinks I'm worth the effort.

I put my spoon down and reach for her hand. She takes it and seconds later when she knows I can't tell her how I feel, she looks at me.

"I know you love me Darrel" She says it so naturally.

It was still our game. She knew that I was calling from the depths of depression, a place I've never before called her from, but she knew why I called her. She held my hand and lifted me out of my sinful existence and reminded me of our Holy bond. She knew how I felt even though I was speechless.

Youth and Family Ministries Annual Report - 2006

You may notice that the name has changed from Youth Committee to Youth and Family Committee. This change reflects our intention to lift up not only our youth, but entire families. We feel it is important to recognize that the family is the foundation for building and growing in faith. This also reflects the combination of the Parish Education and Youth Committees. This committee will not only be responsible for youth group activities at all ages but also for Sunday School, Confirmation, Elementary age Bibles, and First Communion. Our hope is that we will add family activities and emphasis in the year to come.

2006 has been an interesting year for Youth and Family. There have been some definite ups as well as several downs. The silver lining is the committed parents that have given their all to try and keep the youth engaged as well as revive an active and exciting youth program. The youth of Trinity have long been the seed that brings our congregation together and helps us grow as a close community. We hope to keep that seed growing and blossom it into great things in 2007!

Summary

Spring

In April the Trinity GOLD Group (High School) held an auction dinner that had outstanding turnout from Church members and some great service from our Youth. We raised approximately \$6000 to be used for the Mission trip to Minneapolis last summer. Mary Aubert, Sue and Ed Lindner, Stu Johnson and our great GOLD and HYPER youth devoted their time to ensure a fantastic and successful event. Sunday School during early 2006 (prior to summer break) was headed up by Carry Schmitt. We were using the Work Shop Rotation Model Curriculum. It was a struggle to find teachers to commit to the four week sessions but Carry and some steadfast teachers carried it off thanks to their hard work and dedication! Thank you all! Due to his demanding work/travel schedule Ed Lindner stepped down from the Chair in May and Jody Horn stepped in to fill his term.

Summer

Our Youth Director, Aubrey, decided to leave Trinity and return to work at Trinity Lutheran College in June. The Council along with the Youth and Family Committee realize we have had a significant turnover in the Youth Director position and are looking at all facets of attracting and maintaining a new Youth and Family Director. This is being done, in part, through exit interviews with those who have left, as well as leadership interviews, in an effort to gain insight on how we can achieve our goals. We recognize that this process has taken a very long time to begin and promise to do our best to move forward productively and quickly. After Aubrey's exit, Ken Greer and others coordinated a highly commendable effort with other volunteers to proceed with the Mission Trip. Kudos to Ken for he organized the tickets.

Three times during the summer several concerned parents met at Jody and Bob Horn's home, along with Pastor Doug, to attempt to resurrect the Youth Program. It was during this time that Jay and Jaime Osborne and Bea and Justin Murrell agreed to step in as temporary leaders for the High School (GOLD) until a Youth Director could be found. As of January 2007 Jay and Jaime are still working with the GOLD on Sunday nights and doing a fabulous job! There are an average of 4-5 kids attending each week. Stu Johnson unexpectedly resigned his position as the middle school youth leader in August. Don Bollman has stepped in for Sunday School this year, however, we still do not have a leader for HYPER. Vacation Bible School was held the week of August 14th with approximately 50 children participating. 25 adults and young adults helped. The true hero of VBS organization was, once again, Teresa Boyes who has led the charge for many years in a row and also deserves a statue!

Fall

Confirmation began in force again in September with a new and improved curriculum. Parent participation has been much better this year and there were many positive comments regarding the new program. The name of Worship on Wednesdays, WOW has recently been changed to FINK, Faith Incubators. There are an average of 27 kids and 9 leaders. There has been very little activity in the Middle School age group (HYPER). There was a Halloween party at the church in October. There have been limited activities for KOOL Gang (2nd -5th grade). There was a swimming party in September with about 15 attending and a well attended Bowling party in November. About 45 people attended that. The 2006/2007 school year began with no Sunday School in place. We currently have no volunteer in charge of organizing Sunday School. Tammy Rismiller, Ayme Ledenko, and LeeAnne Scott have stepped up brilliantly to run a program for ages 3 through 2nd grade. They have an average of 10-20 children attending. The 3rd – 5th graders were taught "Walk Through The Bible" by Pastor Doug until the end of November. Teresa Boyes has taken over this age group this January. Stu Johnson began the year teaching Middle School. After Stu stepped down, Don Bollman graciously replaced him; Don has an average of 3 or 4 attending. The High School has had no Sunday School so far this school year. In November the efforts to find a new Director of Youth and Family Ministries began anew. The search team was appointed and the process continues to move forward. At the time of this writing we have interviewed 7 candidates. There were three who we liked but one that stood out and had all the requirements we were looking for. We plan to bring him and his wife here for a second interview in early March. God willing, we will have a new Director sometime this spring! Overall, it has been a year of struggle and, because of that, real commitment from those who have worked so hard to pick up the pieces and keep on rolling! The Youth and Family Committee has renewed its own commitment to put Trinity's youth program back on track and make it better than it has ever been. Please pray with us that God leads us in the right direction.
